Agenda: D Street Sidewalk Project & Crosswalk
Meeting Recorded by: Mike Aubol, Morton County Engineer

A presentation was given by Mike Aubol regarding current plans for the sidewalk to be built on D Street South. When construction on Highway 49 is finished, the crosswalk and blinking lights will not be replaced unless there is a landing pad on both sides of the crosswalk. This would require at least one block of sidewalk to be connected to the crosswalk on the north side of Highway 49.

Pros and cons of the project were discussed and guests were given time to voice their opinions. All in attendance were concerned for the safety of students walking to school. Alternatives to the D St sidewalk were discussed. Some ideas were discussed and rejected because of price or practicality. All in attendance seemed to be in favor of installing a pedestrian lane on the East side of D Street. No parking would be allowed on that side of the street. Residents of D Street in attendance were in favor, even if they would lose on-street parking. The board instructed Mr. Aubol to see if he could get DOT approval of this option.

Moved by Martwick, seconded by Glasser to table this issue until we have information from the DOT regarding the pedestrian lane on D Street. Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Martwick, seconded by Glasser to proceed with the pedestrian lane if the DOT approves this option as a landing for the crosswalk. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Aubol will be in contact with Mr. Glasser and Mr. Martwick regarding the information he receives from the DOT. If the pedestrian lane is approved by the DOT there will not be another special meeting, if the DOT will not allow the pedestrian lane another special meeting will be called to see how council wants to proceed.

With no further business, it was moved by Glasser, seconded by Schirado to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously.
