Ordinance 2026-1: Moved by Wood, seconded by Emter to place on second and final reading this ordinance updating the Century Code for floodplain management. Motion carried unanimously.

Maintenance: A water leak was repaired on B Street, tiles in the Blue Room have been removed. A 30-day new hire review was done.

Landfill: Moved by Foss, seconded by Swanson to have the metal removed at a price of \$30 a ton. Motion carried unanimously.

Janitor: Moved by Foss, seconded by Wood to have a volunteer, Jaimie Castner, clean until our current janitor returns. Motion carried unanimously.

Chickens: Moved by Foss, seconded by Swanson to approve the chicken ordinance as reviewed and revised by the council. Voting yes: Fitterer, Foss, Kottre, Swanson, and Wood. Voting no: Emter. Motion passed. The ordinance will be reviewed again at the February meeting for election ballot approval.

Council Room Technology: Moved by Foss, seconded by Kottre to purchase a 55" TV and wall mount for up to \$325.00. Motion carried unanimously.

Adjourn: Moved by Kottre, seconded by Wood to adjourn the meeting at 8:30pm. Motion carried unanimously
