Street Project: City Engineer, J Klabunde, was present to discuss the 2027 street project. Moved by Swanson, seconded by Emter to go forward with a 5-million-dollar street project. Motion carried unanimously. Moved by Swanson, seconded by Foss to hire Moore Engineering to hold 1 public meeting for the Street Project and do a Capitol Improvement Plan. Motion carried unanimously. The public meeting will be held April 13<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm. A letter will be sent to the owners of property in Glen Ullin.

Resolution 2026-1: Moved by Swanson, seconded by Kottre to approve this resolution placing the chicken ordinance on the June ballot. Motion carried unanimously.

Maintenance: Moved by Kottre, seconded by Foss to get three truck loads of crushed brick for the water tower road. Motion carried unanimously.

- Gravel Bids: Moved by Kottre, seconded by Foss to get prices for 2 loads of scoria and 8 loads of crushed brick for summer use. Motion carried unanimously.
- Landfill: Moved by Foss, seconded by Swanson to increase debris bury pile disposal to \$30 for a pickup load and \$90 for a trailer load. Anything with free-on will be charged \$30. Motion carried unanimously.
- Emulsion: no decision was made on the amount needed for 2026.

Blue Room Flooring: Moved by Swanson, seconded by Foss to accept the bid from Brendel's Concrete Coatings for \$17,800 to put epoxy on the basement floor of the Blue Room, bathrooms and adjoining hallway. Motion carried unanimously.

Adjourn: Moved by Kottre, seconded by Wood to adjourn the meeting at 8:30pm. Motion carried unanimously
